*Section XV of the HTSUS defines “waste and scrap” as:

- (1) all metal waste and scrap,
- (2) metal goods definitely not usable as such because of breakage, cutting-up, wear or other reasons.

19 CFR 141.89 requires, for iron or steel imports classifiable in Chapter 72 or headings 7301 to 7307 of the HTSUS, a statement of the percentages by weight or carbon and any metallic elements contained in the articles, in the form of a mill analysis or mill test certificate. These certificates should be submitted at the time of importation to the Document Imaging System. 19 CFR 141.89 requires, for aluminum and alloys of aluminum imports classifiable under subheadings 7601.10.60, 7601.20.60, 7601.20.90, or 7602.00.00, HTSUS, a statement of the percentages by weight of any metallic element contained in the article. This can be included on the invoice or a separate document submitted in the Document Imaging System.
